
Breaking down the definition


These graphics go into more detail, including the legal definitions, and so are aimed at audiences who may already have a higher awareness level or who have already seen the introductory graphics in another context.






The S in ESG

Climate Change and Modern Slavery


The use of modern slavery is part of activities increasing climate change, green-house gas emissions and environmental damage.

Spot the signs of modern slavery

The graphics on this page go into detail about some of the common signs, focusing on the indicators of forced labour in particular. These signs are the kind of thing that could be seen from a distance, without needing to know about a worker's individual circumstances, pay or living conditions.


Get the facts
