| <p>Question(s) asked</p> <p>Could you please provide me with information broken down for each of the past 10 years on the number of times a year each of the following companies [Information withheld for website version] investigated by the GLAA faced enforcement action including an advisory letter, a warning letter, a caution, a prosecution, a revoked license, or any other enforcement action. Please provide a count for each of these categories. If you are able to – please provide information on what the details of each enforcement notice was for (e.g. failing to pay holiday pay)</p> <p>Our Response</p> <p>We have examined the list of companies that you have provided and none of the companies have faced enforcement action resulting in sanctions including an advisory letter, a warning letter, a caution, a prosecution, or a revoked licence in the last 10 years. GLAA inspections against our Licensing Standards are only carried out on Labour Providers (gangmasters) to check if they are complying with the terms and conditions of their licences. The companies you have listed are all labour users – i.e. they are supplied and use labour from licensed gangmasters but they do not supply workers themselves. As such, none of them would be subject to a Compliance Inspection by the authority as they do not hold, nor have they ever held, GLAA licences.</p> | |
