



What We've Achieved

- More than <u>400 live operations</u> targeting modern slavery in the UK.
- Project AIDANT in May and June led to <u>111</u> arrests in the UK and some 130 people being encountered who may be considered as victims.



Hundreds of potential victims rescued in UK and overseas.
