Question(s) asked and answer(s):

Please could you tell me how many reports of modern slavery related to sites or companies in the London Borough of Newham have been received by the GLAA, via the Modern Slavery Helpline or any other medium, since the start of 2018?

GLAA response:

We are unable to provide you with information in the format you are requesting, as we do not collect and record data at the local district level. However, following email correspondence, we clarified your request and with your agreement undertook a search of our records involving the following postcode areas E6, E7, E13, E14, E15, E16 and E20. Based on the postcode search, we identified 8 cases, and these are shown in the table below. However, please note, these results should be treated with caution as they are dependent on a postcode being input, as it is not a mandatory field.
